

Plans for Next Year (2017-18)

Pupil Premium will continue to change in the future as we progress through the next academic year however the allocation from the Department for Education is:

- Free school meals (FSM) £935
- Looked after children and eligible pupils who have been adopted from care £1900
- Armed service children £300

The funding for 2017/18 is **£35,343** subject to EFA and our Pupil Premium learner numbers. In addition to the above interventions and provision the following areas will be used to support students:

- A dedicated amount of time from Learning Manager, and other staff
- An increase in provision for English, Maths and Science one to one tutoring and a target to ensure that all of FSM students are worked with
- Year 11 English, Maths and Science additional activities, weekends, holidays, after school and careers guidance
- The deployment of English, Maths and Science specialist staff to provide an extra set for students that have low literacy levels at KS4. This will include all students at a disadvantage
- Support with extra-curricular provision and visits to ensure high levels of participation that include those at a disadvantage

Curriculum Support:

The UTC plans to provide an additional learning session delivered by subject specialists during the extended UTC day. The aim is to spread the availability of these sessions from maths English and science across much of the curriculum to continue to maintain high standards supporting student achievement and attainment.

SEND:

Plans are being implemented to focus on dyslexia support, group and one to one support in Key Stage 4 through the Learning Manager. Greater enrichment opportunities will also be provided in the field of literacy and numeracy.

Attendance:

The UTC maintains a relentless focus on improving attendance for all pupils, particularly for those eligible for pupil premium funding. Rigorous tracking, monitoring and intervention procedures are in place to support all students in meeting the minimum requirement of 95%.

Revision Guides:

Guides will be provided for Y11 students in Maths, English and Science to assist with exam preparation.

Access Arrangements:

Will be applied for following JCQ guidelines. Assessments will be completed by qualified Academy staff.

Evaluating Effectiveness

Our internal tracking and reporting procedures will be used to assess students' progress. The Pupil Premium plan will be formally reviewed each September.
